
Two milk-glass bottles (\$25, right) "remind me of my husband and

simple bloom in each.


"I picture someone on a farm picking apples on orchard ladders, Yasmine says. She'll use these to hang magazines or towels (\$90 for two, right).

THE SCOOP: Yasmine has attended this Bay Area show (Northern California's largest) every month for the past five years. The only time she's missed? Her wedding day. "Even then I was trying to figure out how to make it," she says, laughing.

Yasmine uses the treasures she finds to stock her shop, Maison Rêve, and to sate the urban farmhouse style in her home. "The show is airy and spacious, with vintage accessories next to a weathered-furniture dealer. "If you want a leisurely Sunday to walk the beautiful San Francisco scene and shop with girlfriends, this is a great place," Yasmine says. But to cover the whole thing, "wear tennis shoes and walk fast."

The 9-year-old outdoor show hosts more than 800 dealers. Everything must be at least 20 years old; no reproductions are allowed. Dealers set up at 4 a.m. If you're ambitious, early buying starts at 6 a.m.
